DETAILS OF COOPERATION

CDIA supported activities include:

- a) PFS on the improvement of the wastewater treatment management, sewerage and drainage systems in the districts of Do Son and Duong
- b) Support the city administration in the development of an industrial and domestic wastewater collection and treatment system.
- c) Assist the city in strengthening its own capacity for infrastructure delivery focusing on environmental sustainability and climate change.
- d) Link identified investments to potential financiers.
