<p>The overall city's development plans focus on the following areas: The vision of Palu of 2010-2025 as stated in the Long-term Development Planning (DPIP) is for Palu to be "the Bay City based on services, tourism, industry and trade with ecological insight". In the RTRW (Spatial Plan) of Palu for the period of 2010-2030, Palu Bay area is identified as a strategic area because of its influence on economic growth through tourism and sport as well as its environmental importance for the city. Initiatives already undertaken include relocating slum dwellers into new areas equipped with housing and other basic infrastructure.
