Investment in the urban water and sanitation sector has centered primarily on its capital Phnom Penh and, as a result, infrastructure and institutional development in provincial towns has suffered from inadequate levels of investment. Urban water supply and urban sanitation services in Cambodia are delivered in an uncoordinated and financially unviable manner countrywide. The Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Agence Française de Développement (AFD) are engaged in supporting the Government of Cambodia to address the core problem of inadequate water supply and sanitation infrastructure and services.
