#### KEY CITY DEVELOPMENT ISSUES

The government of Indonesia's (GOI) slum alleviation policy aims to improve access to public services, drinking water, wastewater, solid waste, drainage, local roads and living conditions for slum residents. While the GOI has conducted a range of slum alleviation projects since the 1960's, it currently recognizes that while these have resulted in the reduction of slums and improved access to public services, they have failed to contend with the development of new slums. Considering the existing rapid urbanization rate and the already existing 35,000 hectares of slums in Indonesia, there is a need to reassess previous programs and develop a new approach that will accelerate slum alleviation efforts and prevent the proliferation of new slum areas.

#### DETAILS OF COOPERATION

The primary objective of the project is to (i) develop the Slum Improvement in Strategic Human Settlements Area (SISHA) Concept; (ii) identify, prioritize and map required infrastructure investments in slum areas in five cities (Cirebon, Banjarmasin, Sorong, Palembang and Makassar) and (iii) conduct pre-feasibility studies (PFS) and outline design on identified priority infrastructure investments.
